





Interethnic Integration in Education Project

DURATION: December 2011 - March 2017

PROJECT BUDGET: \$ 6,200,000

IMPLEMENTER: Macedonian Civic Education Center (MCEC) in partnership

with local NGOs

OBJECTIVES: Build awareness and provide diversity training, technical assistance, and incentives to school boards, principals, teachers and municipal education officials in support of interethnic integration in education

PRIMARY TARGETS: Primary and secondary schools, including students, teachers, school board members, parents and local communities



COMPONENT 1:

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

GOAL: Raising the awareness and the understanding of the importance of the ethnic integration and the reason why it is of vital importance for the stability of Macedonia.

COOPERATION WITH MEDIA OUTLETS

- Over 2000 published and broadcasted information in different media outlets, portals and web sites at local and national level.
- ► The USAID Interethnic Integration in Education Project (IIEP) Team had guest appearances in many TV and radio programs.
- Over 40 meetings for coordination purposes were organized with editors-in-chief of different media outlets.
- About 35 field visits and activities organized for editors and journalists.
- Different outreach tools developed and applied to better inform public and communities.

PUBLIC PROMOTIONAL EVENTS

- 46 ribbon-cutting ceremonies marking the completion of the renovated schools including more than 4000 citizens from different communities.
- ▶ Manual for the Interethnic Integration Certification Procedure which was promoted before more than 130 representatives from the educational institutions, the schools, master trainers, mentors, donors and international organizations.
- Manual for 40 Sports Activities and Entertainment Games for Integration of Children and Young People promoted and the games it comprises demonstrated before more than 500 guests.
- ▶ Festival of Innovative Practices "Through Innovation to a Better Integration" at which the most innovative practices for IIE were awarded and presented in front of more than 350 guests.
- ► Festival of Performing Arts and Good Practices "Be Creative Be Interactive Be Interethnic" which was attended by more than 600 students, teachers, parents and other visitors.
- ▶ Fair of Demonstration Schools at which activities and products from the joint work of students from different languages of instruction were presented and at which more than 200 students and teachers

- participated, as well as more than **400** other representatives of the educational institutions and schools from all over Macedonia.
- Awarding the winners of the secondary school competition "Multivia-Media: How do we coexist together in the schools" an event that was attended by more than 150 guests from USAID, school principals, teachers, students.
- ▶ Video story "Creative Communities" promoted before more than 100 guests from USAID, school principals, teachers and students.
- 6 Open Days of Interethnic Integration in Education in which 49 schools participated organized to promote IIE activities in the local communities.
- ▶ 21 public debates on topics in the context of interethnic integration in which approximately 2000 participants from different secondary schools throughout Macedonia took part and 18 debate clubs established in the secondary schools involving more than 600 students.

SCHOOLS AND STUDENTS

- Over 900 teachers and students from secondary schools trained for using multimedia accesses when creating contents that promote interethnic integration.
- ▶ 433 teachers School Integration Team (SIT) members trained for effective public presentation in the context of interethnic integration in education.
- Debate Academy utilizing debate as a tool for building bridges attended by around 120 students.
- ▶ 15 Forum Theatre workshops in which methodologies for creative resolution of different situations were demonstrated before more than 1400 secondary school students in Macedonia.
- Creative corners were established in 7 secondary schools throughout Macedonia and more than 200 students participated in the activities together with their teachers.

COMPONENT 2:

TRAINING OF TEACHERS, SCHOOL MANAGEMENT REPRESENTATIVES AND MUNICIPALITY EMPLOYEES IN CHARGE OF EDUCATION

GOAL: Provide teachers, school managers, school boards, parents and municipality employees with the skills to work and create conditions to advance interethnic integration.

INSTITUTIONS

- Established certification procedure for teachers for IIE in all primary and secondary schools in Macedonia.
- ▶ About **18500** certificates were prepared and issued.
- ▶ IIE Indicators incorporated in the Manual for Integral Evaluation of Schools in the State Education Inspectorate (SEI), modified instruments for IIE in the Manual for Integral Evaluation.
- ▶ The SEI inspectors were trained to use the IIE indicators during the implementation of the integral evaluation of the schools.
- ▶ The IIE concept was integrated in the SEC trainings for state exam taking by the principals of primary and secondary schools.
- 46 master trainers trained and involved in the project.

SCHOOLS

- Established SITs in all primary and secondary schools in Macedonia (436).
- ▶ 2433 SIT representatives of schools included in the training.
- ▶ 434 representatives of the school professional staff trained in 387 schools.

- ▶ 450 school board representatives and 432 schools included in the training.
- 450 active participants in the mentoring meetings members of school boards, school professional staff and municipality employees in charge of education.
- ▶ 160 teachers trained for implementation of joint student sports activities and entertainment games, organized in 38 primary schools in 37 municipalities.
- Participation of 1800 students in joint sports and fun student activities.

PARTNERSHIPS

- ▶ **395 partnerships** established among the schools in the country.
- Small grants awarded for joint school activities of 218 schools.
- About 1000 joint students' activities organized through small grants provided.
- 9 schools included in a programme for parental inclusion in IIE and about 40 individual IIE activities including more than 100 parents organized.



COMPONENT 3:

DEMONSTRATION SCHOOLS

GOAL: Providing various interventions in several schools that may serve as models for integrated schools throughout the entire country.

SCHOOLS

- ▶ 6 demonstration schools established in Macedonia.
- ▶ 586 teachers and representatives of the professional and management bodies included in the activities and trainings.

ACTIVITIES

211 students, 115 parents and 28 members of school boards involved in trainings for IIE.

- ▶ Over **3223 students** and **186 teachers** actively included in more than **148** joint long-term **extra-curricular activities**.
- ▶ Over 1000 students, together with their parents and with the support of the teachers, have undertaken more than 153 initiatives embodied in different activities, such as: Democratic participation, multicultural workshops, field trips, sports and fun activities.
- ▶ Training for representatives/teachers from the demonstration schools for development of public outreach skills using social media and other tools.

COMPONENT 4:

PROVIDING INCENTIVES TO SCHOOLS AND LOCAL COMMUNITIES

GOAL: Provide school refurbishments as an incentive for schools to participate in interethnic integration activities. This component is financed by the United States European Command.

RENOVATIONS

- ▶ 63 schools renovated and maintenance tools delivered to the schools, which improved the working conditions in the schools.
- ▶ **46181** students and **5107** teachers have benefits from the renovation.
- ➤ The participation of the municipalities in the costs for renovation of 48 schools is 15.18% and the participation of MoES is 27.95%.

TRAININGS

- Publication "Guidelines Manual for Maintenance of the School Buildings" printed and included in the legal regulation of MoES.
- ▶ School Renovation Teams (SRT) established in 63 schools.
- Over 442 SRT members trained for preparation of annual maintenance plans and budgets.
- ▶ **181** SRT members trained for maintenance of schools buildings.

INCLUSIVENESS

- RESPECT FOR GENDER AND ETHNIC REPRESENTATION IN ALL PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND TRAININGS FOR THE PARTNERS AND
- SPECIAL EMPHASIS IS PUT

- INCLUSION AND PROVIDED UNHINDERED ACCESS FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS.

IIEP MONITORING AND EVALUATION

- Implemented five consecutive electronic surveys of the current status in the schools and reports available for the public.
- Active cooperation with the working group of the MoES for Monitoring and evaluation of the integrated education in the R.M.
